

WASHINGTON INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL VOLUNTEER & CULTURAL IMMERSION TRIP MARCH 24-APRIL 2, 2018

DAY 1: GROUP ARRIVAL AND LIMA EXPLORATION- Arrive at the Jorge Chavez International Airport in Lima where CCS staff and vans await. Transfer to the 'Home-Base' in the nice middle-class neighborhood of Surco, just south of downtown Lima. Settle in, meet our amazing CCS Peruvian staff and receive an orientation to the country and expectations for the week ahead. In the afternoon tour downtown colonial Lima with our knowledgeable guide. Visit the famous Plaza de Armas, San Francisco Cathedral, and Plaza Mayor, focal points for much of Peru's fascinating colonial to modern history.

DAYS 2-6: GLOBAL HEALTH PROJECTS- Over the course of the next week, your group will volunteer each weekday morning in an elderly center and daycare. Students will examine the social determinants of public health in the community while working to resolve a public health challenge in the areas of Nutrition, Sanitation, and Dental Hygiene. In addition to providing educational support to students, the group will experience the tangible accomplishment of a much needed enrichment project such as building wash stations, gardens, painting educational murals, and providing dental supplies and workshops. Site visits, guest speakers, and cultural activities will be facilitated by CCS bilingual trained staff and local professionals. AFTERNOON **CULTURAL ACTIVITIES**- Each afternoon enjoy guided cultural activities include bartering in the Incan Market of Miraflores, a stroll down the beachfront strip of El Malecon, a tour of the bohemian neighborhood of Barranco. Explore the pre-Incan ruins at Huaca Pucllana and Pachacamac. Meet engaging Peruvian activists, journalists, and move our feet with an Afro-Peruvian dance lesson!

Day 7-9: THE SACRED VALLEY AND MACHU PICCHU

Take an internal flight from Lima to Cuzco. Explore the magnificence of the Inca Empire with a Sacred Valley tour, visiting sites such as Qurikancha, the Temple of the Sun. Visit a Ilama farm to learn about their historically vital role in Peruvian culture. Journey to Machu Picchu, referred to as the "Lost City of the Incas" or the "City in the Sky." Take a train and a bus from Cuzco to reach this Seventh Wonder of the World. Spend the day on a guided tour of Machu Picchu and stay the night in Aguas Calientes, a town nestled down in a gorge below the ruins of Machu Picchu.

DAY 10: RETURN HOME:

Enjoy your final morning in Cuzco with some souvenir shopping and a celebratory meal before departing on a flight back to Lima and then back home.
